Sub:- TS LAW CET / TS PGLCET-2020 (Admissions) - LL.B / LL.M Admissions - Communication of guidelines to fill left over vacancies under spot admissions at your Institution level and collection of Final List of admitted candidates - Regarding.

You are aware that the Final phase of TS LAW CET / TS PGLCET-2020 web-based counseling allotment and reporting last date in colleges is **17th February, 2021** for the academic year 2020-2021.

The vacant seats if any may be filled by candidates as per their merit in TS LAW CET / TS PGLCET-2020 through SPOT ADMISSIONS at your institution level on the scheduled date. You are requested to give a notification in one of the leading daily News Papers of your region (an original copy to be submitted) on or before **23rd February, 2021** calling the candidates, who have qualified in TS LAW CET / TS PGLCET-2020 examination to attend for counseling at your institution on scheduled date (the date should be specified in the advertisement itself by institutions). You should also mention in the notification the Rank, Hall Ticket Number, Name, Course of the candidates and allotted category who did not report to the institution stating that his/her admission will be treated as cancelled if he/she fails to report one day before the actual date of the institution spot admissions.

Spot admissions are for the left-over vacancies / dropout vacancies / cancelled seats if any at the institutional level. The candidates should be advised to produce all the original certificates before admission and one set of Photo copies should be submitted at the time of ratification with the Principal's signature. All spot admissions shall be filled strictly in accordance with the regulations prescribed in G.O.Ms.No.64. dt.26.05.2006 / GO.Ms.No.250. dt.27.10.2008, GO.Ms.No.31. dt.18.03.2009 and GO.Ms.No.116. dt.07.08.2007 (As per GO.Ms. No. 64 para no 6 (ii) 12 the vacant seats handed over by the Convener shall be notified and filled by the institution on merit basis following the Rules of Reservation as provided under Rule 7. Such seats in case of unaided Minority Institutions shall be first filled with eligible candidates belonging to the concerned Minority and then with eligible candidates belonging to other than the concerned Minority.) as the case may be and their subsequent amendments. **Any deviation made in this regard will be viewed seriously and such admissions will not be ratified under any circumstance.** The cut-off date for Private Law College Managements to fill the left-over vacancies is **26th February 2021.**

The seats earmarked for women candidates in OC / BC / SC / ST categories are to be offered first to women candidates only. If women candidates are not available in that category, then the seats are to be offered to male candidates. The women candidates are also eligible to opt for male seats (General seats) in the combined rank order in any category (OC / BC / SC / ST) even after their own 1/3 quota of seats are filled. If candidates (male / female) are not available in one reservation category, the seats are to be offered to the next reservation category as mentioned below.

Example: 1. BC-E (Girl) → BC-E (Boy) → BC-A (Girl) → BC-A (Boy) →
BC-B (Girl) → BC-B (Boy) → BC-C (Girl) → BC-C (Boy) →
BC-D (Girl) → BC-D (Boy) → OC (Girl) → OC (Boy)

In case, seats reserved for BC category are unfilled even after exhausting all the candidates of BC- A, B, C, D and E (following rules of conversion), such seats may be offered to OC Candidates.

The detailed notification for spot admissions should be kept in your college website also and the same should be mailed to the Convener, TS LAW CET / TS PGLCET-2020 Admissions.

The Spot Admissions should be made as per the scheduled dates given below by the Convener, TS LAW CET / TS PGLCET – 2020 Admissions.

ELIGIBILITY FOR TS LAW CET / TS PGLCET ADMISSIONS 2020

- ✓ **3-Year LL.B / BL:** For 3-year LL. B Course, the candidate should have passed any Graduate Degree (with 10+2+3 pattern) of a recognized University with 45% of aggregate marks for general category and 40% for SC/ST or any other examination recognized as equivalent by the Universities concerned 44.5% or more shall be rounded off and treated as 45%.
- ✓ Those candidates who passed any graduation/degree with 10+3+2 pattern as against the 10+2+3 pattern as prescribed by the Bar Council of India may be admitted if found eligible otherwise subject to the final result of W. P. No: 22656 of 2019 Dated: 25.10.2019 and subject to the submission of declaration cum undertaking as mentioned in the Interim Orders in the said writ petition.
- ✓ The candidates who have less than the prescribed percentage but have secured the same percentage or more on the aggregate in any PG Degree (Masters Degree) or B.Ed. are eligible.
- ✓ The candidates should have qualified in the TS LAW CET-2020
- ✓ The candidates who passed any graduation/degree and secured less than the minimum required percentage of marks as prescribed by the Bar Council of India in its Legal Education Rules and in the G. O. Ms. No. 64, Higher Education Department Dated 26.05.2006 have to submit the declaration cum undertaking form.

- ✓ **The candidates who have passed Degree examination by single sitting without undergoing three years course either through regular or private or correspondence and those who obtained the degree through open University directly without having any basic qualification are not eligible.**
- ✓ **The graduates who obtained their degree through External Examinations etc will be considered for admission in accordance with Clause (4) of G.O.Ms.No.64 dt: 26.05.2006, if they fulfil other eligibility conditions and subject to an undertaking cum declaration submitted by the candidate if admitted.**
- ✓ **5-Year LL.B / BL:** For 5-year LL.B. Course, the candidate should have passed two year Intermediate Examination (with 10+2 pattern) with 45% of aggregate marks for general category and 40% for SC/ST or any other examination recognized as equivalent by the University concerned or the Board of Intermediate Education, T.S./ A.P. 44.5% or more shall be rounded off and treated as 45%.
- ✓ ***“The Candidates of Telangana Open School Society, who have qualified in the year 2020 in various entrance examinations at State and National Level and will be appearing for the counseling session, shall be treated as having minimum required percentage of marks, at Intermediate level, as prescribed by various entrance examination authorities”.**
- ✓ Therefore, in view of G.O.Ms. No.17, Dated 29.10.2020 issued by the School Education Department of Telangana, such of the above students with less than the minimum required percentage will be admitted subject to Declaration cum Undertaking to the effect that neither the TSCHE nor the Convener, TS LAW CET & PGLCET – 2020(Admissions) nor the concerned university shall be responsible if any problem arises with regard to enrollment as advocates on the roles of any State Bar Council after completion of their course.
- ✓ The candidates who passed Intermediate and secured less than the minimum required percentage of marks as prescribed by the Bar Council of India in its Legal Education Rules and in the G. O. Ms. No. 64, Higher Education Department Dated 26.05.2006 have to submit the declaration cum undertaking form.
- ✓ The candidates should have qualified in the TS LAW CET-2020
- ✓ **The applicants who have obtained 10 + 2 or Graduation / Post graduation through open Universities without having any basic qualification are not eligible for admission into LL.B Courses.**
- ✓ **LL.M:** The candidates should have passed LL. B / BL (3/5 year) from recognized University
- ✓ The candidates should have qualified in the TS PGLCET-2020

Processing Fee: Candidates have to pay a **non-refundable processing fee** of Rs.800/- (and Rs.500/- in case of SC/ST) at the time of certificate verification through RTGS/NEFT, in favour of **the Convener, TS LAW CET / TS PGLCET 2020 Adms., into our A/C No 305412010000007 with Union Bank, Barkatpura Branch, Hyderabad (IFSC Code: UBIN0830542)** and enclose original RTGS / NEFT pay-in-slip with list of candidates for approval.
